U *Dvanaestim Monitoring Novostima*, ANEM vam predstavlja:

1. Dvanaesti Monitoring Izveštaj – U junu 2010, medijsku scenu Srbije je, prema nalazu monitoring tima, karakterisalo sledeće:

Nastavljeno je ugrožavanje slobode izražavanja, a u ovom mesecu su zabeležene pretnje smrću, poziv na bojkot, pretnje ili pokretanje sudskih postupaka protiv novinara i medija, koji mogu rezultirati jačanjem autocenzure u medijima. Implementacija postojećih zakona pokazuje njihove nedostatke koje je neophodno ispraviti, jer dovode do problema u praksi. Zakon o elektronskim komunikacijama je, kao i gotovo sve što se dešava u medijskom sektoru, stvorio uslove za neka poboljšanja, ali i za nove probleme u medijskoj praksi. Regulatorna tela pokazuju veći stepen angažovanja, ali više reaktivno nego preventivno - reagujući na probleme, a ne stvarajući uslove da do njih ne dođe. Kolektivne organizacije su svojim aktivnostima dale posredno objašnjenje zašto nisu prihvatile sniženje njihovih tarifa za emitere, kao korisnike predmeta njihove zaštite. Državni organi još nisu obezbedili uslove za pomak nabolje u medijskom sektoru, jer ni u ovom mesecu nije bilo suštinskih promena, sistemskih rešenja pojedinih medijskih problema. Privatizacija i digitalizacija još uvek nemaju potrebnu pažnju i podršku vlasti. Ipak, Medijska studija i najavljena javna rasprava o Medijskoj strategiji za koju je ova studija polazna osnova, mogu doprineti suštinskom progresu medijskog sektora, ukoliko budu iskorišćeni za konstruktivan dijalog između vlasti i medijskog sektora i za nalaženje zajedničkih i pravih rešenja za postojeće probleme i pravac razvoja medijske scene, a ne za produbljivanje jaza između njih.

In the **Twelfth Monitoring News Letter**, ANEM presents:

1. The Twelfth Monitoring Report – according to the findings of monitoring team, in June 2010, the media scene in Serbia was characterized by the following:

Threat to freedom of expression has continued in this monitoring report, which was also marked with cases of death threats, calls for a boycott, the threat or initiation of court proceedings against journalists and media that could result in the strengthening of self-censorship in the media. Implementation of existing laws points out to their shortcomings that need to be corrected, as they cause problems in their practical application. Law on electronic communications has, like almost everything that happens in the media sector, created conditions for some improvements, but also laid grounds for new problems in the media practice. Regulatory bodies show a greater degree of their engagement, however, more reactive than preventive – by reacting to problems and not creating the conditions to prevent them. With their activities, collective organizations have indirectly explained why they have not accepted tariff reduction for broadcasters as users of items of their protection. The authorities have not yet provided better conditions for the improvements in the media sector, as in this month as well there were no substantial changes and systemic solutions of some media issues. Privatization and digitalization processes still do not have the necessary attention and support of the authorities. However, the Media study and announced public debate on the Media Strategy for which this study is a starting point, may contribute to the

substantial progress of the media sector, if they are used for constructive dialogue between the Government and the media sector, as well as to find common and real solutions to existing problems and direction of further development of the media scene, rather than to deep the gap between them.

The monitoring team will, through the review of the distinctive events in all areas that are subject to monitoring, enable readers of the Report to stay informed and properly understand what is happening in the media scene in Serbia.
